TEAMSTERS in the Schools

Local 572 represents thousands at LAUSD



Southern California's eyes were on the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) teachers' strike earlier this year. However, teachers are not the only LAUSD employees working at making our community's schools successful. LAUSD also employs school administrative assistants, plant managers, food service managers, area school bus supervisors, construction inspectors, architects, engineers, and many others known as 'classified employees.'

Within LAUSD, Local 572 represents Unit S which includes about 3,600 classified employees.

Last summer, Local 572

secured a contract with a 6% wage increase for our LAUSD members. That contract also doubled the bilingual differential for members, who play an important role translating and interpreting at Los Angeles area schools.

"Teamsters always fight hard to get us the best contract possible," said Local 572 Executive Board Member and Shop Steward Carolyn Flemister.

"Knowing you have job protection makes working a lot easier." She stressed that she especially values the raises and family leave benefits the Union has secured.

School Administrative Assistant and Shop Steward Norma Muniz fought for the increased bilingual differential pay. She appreciates the knowledge and power of her Local 572 representatives, including Business Representatives Adriana Salazar Avila and Mike Ford.

"Adriana is amazing. In negotiations, she has no hesitation. Anything they throw at her, she knows the answers," Muniz said.

Both Adriana and Mike are committed to winning the best possible contract for these classified supervisors. "They work with students and parents. They are part of the school community and they deserve fairness and good pay for the important work they do," said Adriana. She stressed that members can look forward to preparing for negotiations for additional improvements in a contract re-opener this year.

For nearly half a century, Local 572 has won industry-leading agreements for members at Ralphs Grocery. Today, approximately 700 Local 572 members work at the Ralphs Compton Distribution Center.

Our Local Union represents drivers under the regional Frozen Food Agreement, warehouse workers under the Dairy Plant and Refrigerated Warehouse Agreement, office clerical staff under the Food Industry Office Agreement, as well as members under the Crate and Salvage Yard Agreement. All four of these Joint Council 42 multi-union contracts

offer members wages and benefits that set the standard for the grocery industry. Teamsters working at Ralphs are among the highest paid in the industry. Even in an era where health benefits are constantly threatened, thanks to Union strength the members at Ralphs still enjoy these benefits at no cost to the members.

Business Agents Tait Skifstrom and Steve Badger insist the members at Ralphs are some of the most dedicated and hard-working Teamsters around.

Dennis Watson's Retirement Brings a New President and Recording Secretary to Local 572

Local 572's Executive Board elected Lourdes Garcia as President to finish out Dennis' term to the end of the year. While she is new to the presidency, she is not a new face to Local 572's members. Many know her as Local 572's powerhouse attorney who is always prepared to challenge management to enforce our members' rights.



Across-the-Board Improvements at UPS

A new contract means wage increases and better healthcare and pension benefit



Members at UPS ratified a new five-year contract on April 29. Their contract is part of the National Master Agreement.

The five-year agreement brings improvements to wages, healthcare, and pension benefits going back to August 2018. Starting wages are now \$13/hour. Members who are already at or above \$13 will receive wage increases.

Under the new agreement, members will no longer have a deductible on their healthcare benefits. Part-timers will now be vested in healthcare benefits at nine months instead of a year. A lifetime cap on retiree medical benefits has been lifted. Retired members now have unlimited medical benefits. Members will also see an increase in their pension benefits.

In total, the new agreement offers \$4.15 minimum wage increases and \$5 health and pension increases over the life of the contract.

"This contract not only

increases wages but secures health and pension benefits that are the envy of many. The improvements to pension benefits are so important to Teamsters and our families," said Gerardo "Lalo" Gallardo, Trustee, Shop Steward and package car driver who has been at UPS for 27 years.

Local 572 represents approximately 600 drivers, loaders, and unloaders at UPS locations in Gardena and at the Long Beach airport.







a living wage at ategourmet

After a dedicated Union effort, hundreds win increased wages.



More than 800 Teamsters at LAX Gate Gourmet have won a wage increase after a strong fight. Last year, Local 572 and two Shop Stewards went to the Department of Airports demanding fairer treatment of the members who ensure airplane passengers have food on their flights. The Union has been fighting for years to bring members at Gate Gourmet into the LAX Living Wage Ordinance.

The Living Wage Ordinance guarantees a living wage to many who work at LAX. But some groups like Gate Gourmet had been excluded. Enough was enough.

Shop Stewards Ana Alvarado and Martin Hernandez joined Union representatives last year in making a forceful demand of the company: Either give members medical benefits or pay them the airport's living wage. The company chose to pay the higher wage.

In June, members began receiving back pay dating to January 1, 2019. Starting in June, they will receive the airport's living wage.

The Union is still going through contract negotiations, fighting for additional wage increases for the hundreds of people who make and deliver food for airplanes.

"This fight was a big step, and we are still fighting for more," said Business Agent Jaime Villanueva.

Villanueva has been in the battle for a living wage for those who work in kitchens at LAX for years. He plans to keep the pressure on for what the members deserve.

Ana Alvarado was a Shop Steward at Gate Gourmet for over 20 years. She fought wholeheartedly to win better pay and fair treatment for her fellow Union members. Ana was a leader in the fight for a living wage at Gate Gourmet. She passed away right before she would have reaped the benefits of the fight she won.

Ana was devoted to the Union cause and made sacrifices to advance the cause she believed in. She knew she was doing the right thing for her fellow members and for her family.

Business Agent Jaime Villanueva remembers Ana as one of the strongest Union members he ever met. When he first became a Union Representative, In Memoriam

it was Ana who gave him a tour of the facility, helped him learn about the working conditions, and assisted the Union effort every way she could.

"She helped me to be a better Business Agent," Villanueva said.

Ana Alvarado played a huge role in winning a living wage for her fellow members at Gate Gourmet. She is survived by two sons and a daughter of whom she was very proud. Local 572 is honored to have known such a dedicated fighter for justice. The Union sends our sympathies to her family.

"Ana was a warrior for the working people," said Villanueva. "We will miss her dearly."

Teamsters deliver an outstanding retail contract

"Rick Middleton delivered hands-down the best retail contract in the nation," reported Business Representative Doug Brown. He was talking about the new Western Region Costco contract ratified this spring.

The contract brings substantial wage increases and pension improvements to thousands of Teamsters, including 1,700 Local 572 members.

The new contract includes a generous pay increase. Members will also see an increase in pension contributions from Costco.

Additional contract highlights include an enhanced procedure for vacation bids as well as increased job protection, and additional benefits for seasonal and probationary employees, such as jury duty pay and Sunday premium pay.







LOCAL 572 WINS MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS at STORER TRANSPORTATION (PALMDALE)

The Union triumphed with substantial wage increases and unprecedented benefits

When Storer took over as school bus contractor for the Palmdale School District, Local 572 stepped in to achieve major improvements for the members. More than 100 drivers, bus aides, and mechanics received a substantial wage increase in a new contract ratified in June.

The contract includes a vast improvement in wages. And while the company does not typically offer bereavement benefits, the Union negotiating committee fought to ensure members at the Palmdale location would have this important benefit. The contract also maintains Teamsters TIP health benefits and gives the drivers and bus aides two additional holidays and one additional sick day.

Local 572 President Lourdes Garcia was the chief negotiator for the exceptional agreement. Business Agent Michael Williams served on the negotiating committee, along with Shop Stewards Tina Brown and Patricia Avery, and Bus Aide Mary Diaz.

"These were successful negotiations, and we couldn't have done it without the support of our members. When a company knows the Union has the support of our membership, it makes a big difference," said Local 572 President Lourdes Garcia.

The members were indeed firmly behind Local 572.

"In 13 years, these were the fastest negotiations I've ever been a part of," said Shop Steward Tina Brown. "I'm very pleased. We got

more sick time, more holidays and improvements to vacation time. And we got the bereavement time we fought for. That was big."

"Our Local Union is proud to win substantial wage increases and important benefits and protections for our members," said Business Agent Michael Williams. He added that he looks forward to working with the Storer management team to ensure Local 572 members are treated like the professionals they are.

Hundreds See Contract Improvements at Durham/San Bernardino

Drivers, bus attendants and mechanics at Durham/San Bernardino ratified a new contract in February. The four-year contract brings significant wage increases as well as numerous language improvements to our members.

The nearly 400-member bargaining unit overwhelmingly voted to accept their contract

which includes improvements to charter trip rotations, an annual fall bonus for drivers and attendants, a new Accident Review Committee and a Positive Relations Committee.

Business Representative Michael Williams credits Lourdes Garcia for her work as chief negotiator. The Local 572 president fought hard with the support of Bargaining Committee Members Sylvia Galvan, Maria Flores, Lori Gafford, and Glenn Grieve.
